Smith and Klobuchars offices for further grants, Rick Stoehr asks if there is a map. Yes. John Bassing states the vast majority is covered. Lee Peterson asks if kitchen range is working. Chief Maus stated he shut it down because of odd smell of unburnt fuel. J. Horihan asks if it needs service. Lee Peterson recommends turning it on and recommends possible removal of old furnace in fire hall.

BUDGET AND LEVY: John Bassing states in 2022 we received more than we spent due to ARPA funds.Notes Levy History, presents other local levies and their average tax ratios. We are the lowest. Mike Ralston asks what the township offers-Bassing -911 signage at below cost, public water tap, voting precinct, recreation area, tennis/pickleball court, Fire Dept. Mr Koski advises to keep local control.
